

Erwin Huber

Bavarian State Minister of Economic Affairs, Infrastructure, Transport and Technology

State Minister Erwin Huber was born in Reisbach, Lower Bavaria on July 26, 1946. He is Roman-Catholic, married and has two children. After attending the local primary school and then the secondary school in Dingolfing, he joined the Bavarian Financial Administration in 1963, working in several tax offices and from 1970 at the Bavarian State Ministry of Finance. Alongside his job, he attended further education evening classes and then studied economics at Munich University. He completed his degree with a thesis addressing a financial theme.

Erwin Huber was for many years District and Regional Chairman of the Junge Union (Youth Organisation of the German Christian Democrats).

Since 1972 he has been a member of the County Council and County Committee of Dingolfing-Landau. Since 1978 he has been a member of the Bavarian Landtag (State Assembly), where he served as Chairman of the Landtag Committee on "Regional Development and Environmental Affairs" from 1986 to 1987. From 1987 to 1988, Erwin Huber was Deputy Secretary-General of the CSU (Christian Social Union), and from 1988 to 1994 Secretary General of the party. Since June 1993 he has been Chairman of the Regional Executive Committee of the Lower Bavarian branch of the CSU.

On October 27, 1994, Erwin Huber was appointed State Minister and Head of the Bavarian State Chancellery. He held the office of Bavarian State Minister of Finance from November 1995 to October 1998.

1998 - 2003: State Minister and Head of the Bavarian State Chancellery.

On October 14, 2003, Erwin Huber became Head of the Bavarian State Chancellery and State Minister for Federal Affairs and Administrative Reform.

He has been Bavarian State Minister of Economic Affairs, Infrastructure, Transport and Technology since November 29, 2005.
